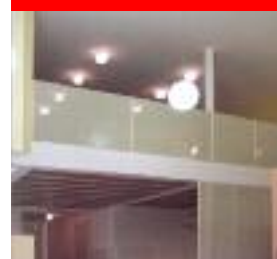

Background to the Making Space Programme



Following the success of the initial 'Making Space' programme, held in 2005, 'Making Space 2010' again sees Children in Scotland working in partnership with the Scottish Government, the OECD's Centre for Effective Learning Environments (CELE), and Architecture+Design Scotland to revisit the design agenda and extend its scope, with Scotland playing host to a two-day international conference and award, which will showcase Scotland as a centre for design innovation.



Submissions for **the award** are invited from across the world for the most successful building or space (indoor and outdoor), completed between January 2005 and December 2010 and the winners will be announced at the Making Space 2010 conference.



This **major conference** brings together a range of international experts who will examine issues related to children and space from aspects of how children and young people relate to their environment and its impact on their development to what makes a good learning environment and what we need to focus on in the future. As well as plenary sessions, delegates will be invited to join one of three study tours visiting inspiring and innovative new buildings and projects in Central Scotland and hearing from those directly involved in their design and planning.

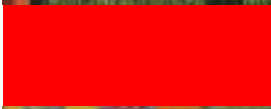
Delegates attending this conference will have an unparalleled opportunity to:

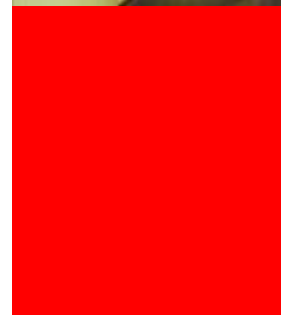
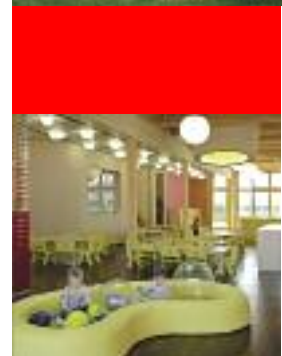
